





## GETTING HERE

**FLY** | The Jackson Hole Airport is 77 miles from Dubois, and Central Wyoming Regional Airport in Riverton is 75 miles away. Commercial service also is available in Cody, Casper, Cheyenne, and Rock Springs.

Dubois is located along the US Highway 26/287, about 75 miles from Riverton and Lander to the east, and 86 miles from Jackson to the west.

The 3rd highway is the newly upgraded town airport which is open for private aircraft and offers jet fuel and aviation gas on a self-service basis. ([duboiswyomingairport.com](http://duboiswyomingairport.com))

**DRIVE** | Dubois is located on U.S. Route 26, offering access from the east and west, and is the beginning of the Wyoming Centennial Scenic Byway, U.S. Route 26 crossing the Continental Divide at Togwotee Pass, 9,658 ft.

US-191 offers access from the north; and US-287 from the south.

## DIRECTIONS

**TO YELLOWSTONE**  
The fastest route to Yellowstone National is US Highway 26/287, west 55 miles to Moran Junction, head north which will take you through Grand Teton National Park from their Moran Entrance and will connect to Yellowstone's South Entrance. (There are five entrances to Yellowstone).

Check out the **Tie Hack Monument** on US Hwy 26, about 18 miles west of downtown Dubois near the Sheridan Creek Forest Service road. The monument stands on a high bluff on the south side of the highway. Look for the large pullout.

**TO GRAND TETON**  
Enter Grand Teton National Park either through the Moran Entrance or near the Moose Entrance with the Craig Thomas Discovery & Visitor Center, 1 Teton Park Road, Jackson, WY.
